It attempts to engage with the social issues relevant to life today: food, art, politics, urban planning, cultural theory, farming, and more. hanare also works together with people from various fields who are experimenting with creative projects to find ways of practicing a new, spontaneous (and sustainable) way of living. While hanare's work has its roots in Kyoto, it also wishes to be a space with direct links to other regional towns and cities in the world.
