

Resources.Lab utilizes design-based research methods to explore the potentials of urban environments in an unpredictable world of increasing social division and uneven distribution of resources.How is change taking place with in the global cities? As the global city today is driven by market forces rather than by ideas of planning as it has been taught in an European Â*raditionÂ*, the essence of what we call citieness $\hat{a} \in \text{``socio-economic diversity and a diversity of typologies, spaces and activities <math>\hat{a} \in \text{``is lost. Many urban theoreticians today are therefore pointing towards the so called informal or the auto-constructed settlements , as environments producing real alternatives and new thinking for the urban. Although created as small-scaled, local and incremental processes, these interventions have possible far reaching effects on the urban development and the society as a whole.$

How can new educational programs and collaborations meet with local practices and give real offers to the urban transformations?
